"70 Years of Positive Public Policy" Event The Maternity Home Delivery Service

Linda Ruholl, RN, PhD, shared her research about the Home Delivery Service, which was provided by the Effingham County Health Department from April 5, 1949 through February 2, 1954. Following the April 4-5, 1949 St. Anthony Hospital fire, the women of Effingham County had no access to in-patient maternity services for many years. It was a time with a high birth rate in this county, as well as in the state of Illinois and the country as a whole, at least as compared to 2017.

The driving forces behind the home delivery service were **Fred Tonney, MD**, the ECHD's first Medical Director, and **Marjorie Scaife, RN, PHN**, the first Supervisory Nurse. They recognized the perils faced by pregnant women nearing their due date, and acted quickly to bridge the gap.

The Home Delivery Service was originally projected to last 18 months. In reality, the Service was needed continously for almost five years. The opening of St. Anthony's ended Memorial Hospital made the service redundant, and it ended quickly. A total of five nurses worked in the service. Two of them, **Frances Pitchford, RN** and **Agnes Schmitz, RN**, stayed in the program for its entire duration.

The Home Delivery Service met its goal: to provide safe and effective maternity care to area families in the absence of in-patient care at a hospital. Over the life of the service, grant funding made it an obvious and wise choice for families with limited resources. The Home Delivery Nurses assisted with the 934 births. There were no maternal deaths (100% survival rate). Of the 937 babies, there were nineteen deaths (mostly stillborns, for a 98% survival rate.

Forty-five individuals attended this program, which was a continuation of the Effingham County Health Department's celebration of 70 years of service to the people of the County. Twenty percent of the attendees were tied in some way to the Home Delivery Service, as they indicated that they, or a member of their family, had been delivered at home sometime between 1949 and 1954.
